ASUF takes pride in its remarkable impact, boasting a 2.3% recidivism rate and 93% employment retention post-graduation.

Our program operates from Monday through Friday, creating a structured environment that **fosters learning** and personal growth.

Sessions run from 1pm to 3pm, with dedicated coaches guiding students through the essential components.

However, our commitment goes beyond the technical aspects. ASUF's holistic approach includes specialized workshops focusing on crucial life skills, such as resume building, interview preparation, and hands-on experiences.
